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1	CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Thank you.
2	MR. PINELLI: Let the record reflect this
3	is a hearing on the Duty Disability benefit
4	application for Duty Disability benefits being made
5	by Karen Gilbride.
6	Good morning, Ms. Gilbride. As you have
7	been told, I'm one of the attorneys for the Pension
8	Fund. I will be conducting this hearing for the
9	record.
10	I'd like to advise you of some
11	preliminary matters before we start evidence.
12	First of all, there are currently six
13	trustees present at this time to hear the evidence
14	on your application. The Pension Code requires
15	that you get the yes vote of at least five of the
16	six trustees in order to get this benefit. Do you
17	understand that?
18	MS. GILBRIDE: Yes, I do.
19	MR. PINELLI: Based on the record, it
20	looks like you do not have an attorney representing
21	you today. Is it your desire to proceed without an
22	attorney?
23	MS. GILBRIDE: Yes.
24	MR. PINELLI: Lastly, it is the

1	applicant's burden of proof to present sufficient
2	evidence to the Board in order for the board to
3	grant a benefit. Do you understand as the
4	applicant it is your burden of proof?
5	MS. GILBRIDE: Yes.
6	MR. PINELLI: By way of procedures, I am
7	going to start by asking you some questions under
8	oath. The board members may or may not have
9	questions of you. Then I will call Dr. Samo to
10	testify the Fund's physician consultant. If there
11	anything that I don't ask him that you think is
12	important for the Board to know, please let me know
13	and you will be given that opportunity.
14	Do you understand the procedures?
15	MS. GILBRIDE: Yes, I do.
16	MR. PINELLI: Then we are ready to
17	proceed. Could I have Dr. Samo and Ms. Gilbride
18	please both raise your right hands.
19	(Witnesses sworn.)
20	KAREN GILBRIDE
21	a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was
22	examined and testified as follows:
23	EXAMINATION
24	BY MR. PINELLI:

1 For the record, would you please state Q 2 your name? 3 Α My name is Karen Gilbride. What is your current rank with the Fire 4 Q Department? 5 Currently my rank is Ambulance Commander. 6 Α 7 What was your last assignment with the Q 8 Fire Department before you went on layup? 9 Α My assignment was at Ambulance 51 but 10 that day that I was injured I was assigned to 11 Ambulance 54 at the airport. 12 Before we get into the incident, first of Q 13 all, I want to make sure that you did receive a 14 copy of the Board Exhibits that have been marked 15 Board Exhibits 1 through 12. Did you get a copy of those before today's date? 16 17 Α Yes. 18 Q Did you have an opportunity to review 19 them? 20 Α Yes. 21 Do you have any objection to the Q 22 admission of those exhibits into this record in 23 support of your application? 24 Α No.

1 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. 2 Mr. Chairman, I move for admission of 3 Board Exhibits 1 through 12 without objection from the applicant. 4 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Admitted without objection. 6 7 (Board Exhibits 1 through 12 were admitted into evidence.) 8 9 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. BY MS. PINELLI: 10 11 Ms. Gilbride, directing your attention to Q October 31st of 2020, were you injured that day 12 13 while at work, which is the basis of your 14 application? 15 Α Yes, I was. 16 Understanding the Board does have the Q 17 benefit of your statement to them with your 18 application, but could you please still briefly describe where you were and what happened to you on 19 that date? 20 21 On that day, again, I was with Ambulance Α 22 54. We were responding to a call to a residential 23 home. My partner and I were on our own and that 24 was for approximately a 65 or 67 year old

1 gentleman. We arrived to the residence to find him 2 in the basement and he did not live there so we got 3 information. He looked pretty critical. We 4 couldn't wait for a fire company so we went ahead 5 and put him on the stair chair. We felt he could go either way at any minute. 6 7 Anyway, we put him on the stair chair. I was at the bottom of the stair chair because we 8 9 were going up the stairs in the basement. It was a 10 bit of a pie shaped. Of course, the gentleman was a bit of a dead weight. He weighed about 250 11 pounds. And so I was carrying him up. Got to 12 13 about the third step. Felt a pop in my right 14 shoulder. I ignored it because the patient needed 15 to go. Continued to carry him up the stairs. As I 16 was working on the patient, I noticed that I was 17 progressively getting worse. I was trying to 18 ignore it. Once we dropped the patient off at the 19 hospital, I realized this was not going away. 20 In 21 fact, it was getting worse, that is when I 22 contacted my field chief. And, of course, told my 23 partner. 24 We then went ahead and went to Little

1	Company complaining of right shoulder pain. They
2	suspected a shoulder rotator cuff tear. I also had
3	numbness and tingling down the right arm and that
4	has persisted the entire time and to this day I
5	still have that problem. But they went ahead and
6	gave me a pain patch and they took an x-ray and I
7	was told to go to Medical. Medical gave me a
8	doctor. That doctor went ahead and requested a MRI
9	with x-rays.
10	At the time that first doctor told me
11	that there was nothing wrong but yet I couldn't
12	lift my arm. Still was having the tingling. He
13	pretty much told me nothing to do. Of course, I
14	got a second opinion with Dr. Leonard at Christ and
15	then he went ahead and took more x-rays. Reviewed
16	the MRI. Suggested that we start with a cortisone
17	short, that really didn't help. I did physical
18	therapy for a few months and then once I still
19	didn't improve with any of that, they went ahead
20	and did surgery. They found a tear. They repaired
21	that. They repaired a couple of other things.
22	Went ahead and did physical therapy.
23	Continued with that. It has improved to a point
24	but I still don't have full range of motion. I am

1 not able to lift not even five pounds. 2 I had a setback in August right before 3 Labor Day, September. And, unfortunately, now my range of motion has decreased but the tingling is a 4 5 problem so they want me to follow and get a MRI again in that area. I apologize. I have this 6 7 better in my head. 8 That's fine. Let's hold off for a 0 9 second. I will come back to your treatment in a 10 moment. 11 Oh, sorry. Α 12 That is okay. You did a good summary Q 13 there. You saved me a lot of the questions that I 14 needed to ask, which is fine. 15 Let me ask you about the condition of 16 your right shoulder before this incident. It looks 17 like from the records you did have a right shoulder 18 strain of some type back in -- was it 2005? Actually, no, that was a middle back 19 Α 20 injury and for some reason Dr. Cook thought possibly it could be the shoulder but I never had 21 22 any injury to the shoulder. It was actually in the 23 middle back. It still gets tight around the spine 24 area. I have had previous injuries to the lower

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1	back and to the middle back around the spine and to
2	this day it still bothers me when I walk too long
3	or stand too long.
4	Q This incident, on October 31st of 2020,
5	that was the first time you ever had an injury to
6	your right shoulder?
7	A Yes.
8	Q Then you went on to tell us the history
9	of your treatment and that you had the surgery and
10	following the surgery you have had physical therapy
11	and some steroid injections but it hasn't relieved
12	your symptoms. Currently you have told us you've
13	got limitations, right, with respect to your right
14	shoulder?
15	A Yes, I do.
16	Q What is the doctor telling you with
17	respect to any future course of treatment at this
18	point?
19	A Right now he is concerned about the
20	tingling since he thought it would have gone away
21	with the shoulder surgery. Before I got off
22	Medical, the Fire Department referred me to a
23	neurologist. Unfortunately, with the neurologist,
24	I needed a second opinion with that gentleman.

1 Anyway, the ortho doctor who did the surgery is requesting a MRI to the shoulder and a 2 3 little bit of the neck area to find out why it is being impeded in the shoulder because we can't go 4 5 forward with therapy until this is done. He still feels that my range of motion is 6 7 limited to the end but we are kind of at a standstill in the last week because we're trying to 8 9 get the MRI. 10 Then you mentioned you had a setback Q 11 there. Was that during the course of your 12 undergoing physical therapy and weight training to 13 try to get back to work? 14 Α Yes. Yes. I was trying to do -- just 15 started doing some strength training and I got to 16 five pounds. And I did two exercises in physical 17 therapy and after the second one I just started to 18 have severe pain and the numbness and tingling increased. 19 20 That day I went home and it was terrible. I was driving home and I had a stabbing sharp pain 21 22 in the top center of my shoulder. It also went 23 around the entire scapula and it also went to the 24 back upper corner of the leg. It really affected

1 the whole back area, the shoulder. 2 I also have a tendon problem in the front 3 of the shoulder, that is near the armpit. I'm sorry. I don't know if you can picture all that. 4 But the back is closer to the other side of the 5 back side of the armpit as well in that area. 6 7 I have sharp stabbing pain with increase of motion and any progression of lifting and also 8 9 the tingling will also increase with that. 10 Okay. Since you went on layup have you Q 11 engaged in any activities by which you earn income? 12 Α No. Have you engaged in any sporting 13 Q activities? By that I don't mean physical therapy, 14 15 I mean actual sporting activities, since you have 16 been on layup. 17 Α No, sir. 18 Are you taking any pain medicine when Q needed prescribed by a physician? 19 Tramadol, Naproxen. When the 20 Α Yes. 21 combination gets going, it kind of helps. The 22 neurologist recommended a stronger arthritis 23 medication. I took it once. I didn't notice any 24 difference. I am just mainly sticking with the

1	Tramadol right now. After the surgery, they don't
2	want to give me anything stronger than Tramadol.
3	MR. PINELLI: Thank you. That is all the
4	questions I have at this time.
5	CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustees, any
6	questions?
7	Thank you.
8	MR. PINELLI: I would call Dr. Samo to
9	testify.
10	(Witness sworn previously.)
11	DANIEL SAMO, M.D.
12	a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was
13	examined and testified as follows:
14	EXAMINATION
15	BY MR. PINELLI:
16	Q Sir, please, state your name.
17	A Daniel Samo.
18	Q You are a physician; is that correct?
19	A Yes.
20	Q Is a copy of your qualifications as a
21	physician attached to the Board Exhibits?
22	A Yes.
22	
22	Q Do you perform a function as a consultant

1 Α Yes. 2 In that capacity do you review medical Q 3 records, either examine or interview applicants and file a written record with the Board? 4 5 Α Yes. Did you follow that procedure with 6 Q 7 respect to Ms. Gilbride? 8 Α Yes. 9 Is a copy of your C.V. marked as Board Q Exhibit Number 2? 10 11 Α Yes. 12 Doctor, did you have the opportunity to Q 13 interview the applicant because of the current 14 Covid protocols you couldn't examine her? 15 Α I did, yes. 16 Was the information she provided to you Q 17 in that interview consistent with the medical 18 records that you had examined? 19 Yes. Α 20 Could you briefly summarize for us what Q 21 the state of her current condition is? 22 Α I mean, her summary of her care Sure. 23 and everything was excellent and her history. 24 Currently she continues to have right shoulder

1 pain, especially when elevating her elbow away from 2 her body above probably 60 degrees. So anything 3 overhead is painful. Also the tingling that she has down the ulnar side, the pinky side of her 4 5 hand, which has been persistent and consistent, which is currently being worked up with MRIs and I 6 7 believe they talked about doing an EMG and NCV, nerve conduction velocity, tests. 8 9 Based on those current symptoms and Q 10 complaints, do you believe she could perform her 11 duties with the Fire Department? 12 Α No. 13 Do you have any recommendations for Q 14 future exams or reexams? 15 Α Shoulders are very slow to heal. It's 16 possible it could improve. I think reexams based 17 on our normal procedures would be appropriate. 18 MR. PINELLI: Thank you, doctor, that is all the questions have. 19 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: 20 Trustees, any questions for the doctor? 21 22 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, I would 23 like to make a motion to grant the benefit 24 requested by Ambulance Commander Gilbride.

1 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Second. 2 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion to 3 grant by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee McPhillips. 4 5 Trustee Murphy. MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 6 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 7 8 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 10 Conyears-Ervin. 11 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 12 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 13 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 14 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. 15 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. 16 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 17 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 18 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Valencia. 19 MEMBER VALENCIA: Yes. 20 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 21 Motion carries. MEMBER MURPHY: I would like to make a 22 23 motion for reexam consistent with the Board's 24 policy.

1 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Motion for reexam by 2 3 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Sheridan. Trustee Murphy. 4 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 6 7 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 9 Conyears-Ervin. MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 10 11 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. MEMBER SONI: Yes. 12 13 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. 14 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 16 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 17 18 Motion carries. MEMBER MURPHY: Counsel has previously 19 sent around proposed Findings of Fact and 20 21 Conclusions of Law in this matter. Having had a 22 chance to review those, I would like to make a 23 motion to approve those Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in this matter. 24

1 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Second. 2 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Motion to adopt by 3 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Conyears-Ervin. 4 5 Trustee Murphy. MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 6 7 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 8 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 10 Conyears-Ervin. MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 11 12 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 13 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 14 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. 15 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. 16 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 17 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 18 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 19 Motion carries. 20 Based on the Findings of Fact and 21 Conclusions of Law made by the Trustees, the 22 Trustees have voted to grant you the benefit you 23 have requested. 24 You will be notified by mail of the

1 Findings of Fact and the Board's decision. 2 MS. GILBRIDE: Thank you, very much, 3 everyone. MEMBER MURPHY: Our next applicant is 4 5 Firefighter Ryan Ray from Squad 2. MR. PINELLI: Mr. Ray, are you on the 6 7 line? 8 MR. RAY: Yes. 9 MR. PINELLI: We are ready to proceed. Let the record reflect this is an 10 11 application for a Duty Disability being made by 12 Firefighter EMT Ryan Ray. 13 Good morning, Mr. Ray. If you don't know 14 you should know I am one of the attorneys for the 15 Pension Fund. I will be conducting this hearing 16 for the record. 17 I'd like to advise you of some 18 preliminary matters before we start the actual evidence. 19 First of all, there are seven trustees 20 present at this time to hear the evidence on your 21 22 application. If you don't know you should know the 23 Pension Code requires that you get the yes vote of at least five trustees in order to receive this 24

1	benefit. Do you understand that?
2	MR. RAY: I understand, yes.
3	MR. PINELLI: I also see that you do not
4	have an attorney that filed an appearance on your
5	behalf. Is it your desire to proceed without an
6	attorney at this hearing?
7	MR. Ray: Correct. Yes.
8	MR. PINELLI: Lastly, it is the
9	applicant's burden to present sufficient evidence
10	to the Board in order for the Board to grant the
11	benefit that the applicant is seeking. Do you
12	understand it is your burden of proof?
13	MR. RAY: I understand.
14	MR. PINELLI: By way of procedures, I am
15	going to start by asking you some questions under
16	oath. The board members may or may not have
17	questions of you. And then I will call the Fund's
18	physician consultant to testify. If there is
19	anything I don't ask Dr. Samo that you think is
20	important for the Board to know, just let me know
21	and you will be given that opportunity. Do you
22	understand the procedures?
23	MR. RAY: I understand.
24	MR. PINELLI: Then we are ready to

1	proceed with the evidence. May I have Dr. Samo and
2	Mr. Ray please raise your right hands?
3	(Witnesses sworn.)
4	RYAN RAY
5	a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was
6	examined and testified as follows:
7	EXAMINATION
8	BY MR. PINELLI:
9	Q Sir, could you please state your name for
10	the record?
11	A Ryan Ray.
12	Q And what is your current rank with the
13	Fire Department?
14	A Firefighter EMT.
15	Q What was your last assignment before you
16	went on layup?
17	A Squad 2.
18	Q Directing your attention to the Board
19	Exhibits, which have been marked Board Exhibits 1
20	through 12, did you receive a copy of those in
21	advance of today's hearing?
22	A I did.
23	Q Did you have a chance to review those
24	records?

1 I did. Α 2 Do you have any objection to their Q 3 admission into the record in support of your 4 application? 5 Α I don't. 6 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. 7 Mr. Chairman, I move for admission of 8 Board Exhibits 1 through 12 without objection from the applicant. 9 10 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Admitted without 11 objection. (Board Exhibits 1 through 12 were 12 13 admitted into evidence.) 14 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. 15 BY MR. PINELLI: 16 Mr. Ray, you are applying for this Duty Q 17 Disability based upon an injury or injuries that 18 you sustained on March 31st of 2019; is that 19 correct? 20 Α Correct. 21 Understanding the Board does have your Q 22 written statement in the submission, could you 23 please still briefly summarize for us where you 24 were and what happened to you on that day?

1 Yeah, absolutely. So we were a little Α 2 late to the fire. We had a three-story apartment 3 building that was a little above the ground floor so we were about 25 to 30 feet in the air doing 4 5 overhaul, search, looking for fire, anything like that. 6 7 As we were about to wrap up, we were going to go check a room, which we thought was a 8 9 bathroom and it was actually the back porch was 10 gone. But it was pitched black and we couldn't see it. 11 12 I took two steps and walked out and felt 13 like I was on a giant drop. I fell about 25 feet. 14 As I was going down, I thankfully missed all the 15 steel I-beams and everything that was kind of still 16 intact and was able to turn to my left side. When 17 I landed on my left side, from what they believe, 18 my elbow and my shoulder dislocated. I immediately had, you know, left-sided pain and from there they 19 called a Mayday. 20 21 Thankfully, I landed right in front of a 22 I just missed him. I was able to grab his guy. 23 leg and he was able to call Mayday and they were 24 able to get me out and get me to the hospital.

1 That is pretty much about it. 2 Let's talk about those parts that you Q 3 injured. First of all, your left elbow you mentioned. Had you ever had any injuries to the 4 left elbow before that date? 5 6 Α No. 7 And the records indicate that you Q ultimately had a surgery on it on April 23rd of 8 9 2019 on your left elbow; is that correct? 10 Α Correct. Yes. 11 Following the surgery, I take it, you did Q some rehabilitation and physical therapy in an 12 13 attempt to get back to work; is that correct? 14 Correct. About eight months worth. Α 15 Q Were you able to successfully 16 rehabilitate your left elbow that allowed you to 17 return to work in January of 2020? 18 Α I did. Let's talk about your left shoulder that 19 Q you injured as well at this incident. Had you ever 20 had any previous injuries to your left shoulder 21 before that date? 22 23 Α Injuries no but pain yes. 24 Can you just briefly describe for us what Q

1	pain that you had in your left shoulder before this
2	date?
3	A Vaguely I kind of remember I am glad
4	they brought it up. But I believe when I was
5	working out when I got to a certain point I had a
6	little bit of like a pinching or sharp pain that
7	was just becoming annoying. So I remember I got it
8	checked out and it just happened to be through the
9	doctor's request that I get a MRI done because he
10	saw nothing on the x-ray and it was actually within
11	I think like 72 hours or four days before the
12	actual incident happened so.
13	Q But you did return to work even with the
14	condition of that pain in your shoulder? Were you
15	working or were you on layup?
16	A Yeah. The doctor said that it was a very
17	minor tear if maybe a cortisone shot or physical
18	therapy at home. I declined the physical therapy
19	because it really wasn't bothering me that bad. It
20	was more like I said an annoyance once in awhile.
21	I just kind of wanted to get it checked out. I was
22	able to go back to full duties no problems.
23	Q And then this incident occurred and as a
24	result of it you underwent treatment for your left

1 shoulder as well, right? 2 Α Correct. 3 You had a surgery on that left shoulder Q on July 9th of 2019? Does that sound right? 4 5 Α Correct. Following that surgery, you underwent 6 Q 7 physical therapy in an attempt to return to work? 8 Α Correct. 9 Q And --10 Α Seven --11 Seven or eight months of physical Q 12 therapy? 13 Correct. Α 14 You were successfully able to return to Q 15 work with the condition of your left shoulder in 16 January of 2020; is that correct? 17 Α Yeah. Correct, with pain. I was still 18 having AC joint pain but the doctor had pretty much 19 said it is not -- you can work with pain so they 20 were able to sign me off and I was able to go back 21 to work for about eight months, seven months. 22 Q Right. And that is what it looks like. 23 Sometime maybe about June or so of '20 you went on 24 layup again for the shoulder; is that correct?

1	A Correct. It was getting worse over the
2	summer. We were going to fires. I was losing
3	mobility fast and the pain was getting worse so I
4	went back to the same doctor that I had for the
5	first two operations.
6	Q Subsequently did he perform a revision
7	surgery?
8	A Yeah. He did an AC resection, or
9	whatever they call it, revision. They cut a little
10	bit of the collarbone back to open up the joint.
11	Q That was in August of 2020, right?
12	A Correct.
13	Q And then were you able to come back after
14	that or not able to?
15	A No. Negative. It actually got worse to
16	the point where I was dependent on pain meds and I
17	was having super sharp pain in the collar bone
18	area, in my shoulder. Physical therapy was getting
19	real nervous. That is when we went I talked to
20	Medical. Everybody was pretty much worried, except
21	for that doctor. He said there is something
22	definitely wrong. It wasn't stabilized or
23	something like that.
24	I ended up getting a doctor going to

1	Dr. Cole. That is where that whole part starts. I
2	don't know if you have questions about that, too.
3	Q Well, yes. I saw that you did go to Dr.
4	Cole and then he tried conservative treatment for a
5	while; is that correct?
6	A Yes, he did. Finally, we kind of came to
7	the conclusion that nothing was going to get
8	better. Physical therapy was at the point where
9	they thought they couldn't do anything more. It
10	was either have surgery or this is how it's going
11	to be the rest of my life.
12	The doctor decided that he was going to
13	go in and do the stabilization. He told me that he
14	might be able to fix the pain but he is not
15	guaranteeing that I would be able to work as a
16	firefighter again.
17	Q Then did you have a third surgery on that
18	left shoulder?
19	A Correct.
20	Q That was in January of this year?
21	A Yes.
22	Q Which doctor performed that?
23	A Dr. Cole.
24	Q Now tell us currently what the condition

1	of your left shoulder is with respect to pain or
2	limitation?
3	A I am very limited. Below my shoulder
4	line, I am pretty decent. I am able to pull
5	weight, push, pull. I really don't have any
6	restriction with that. Once I get to about 90
7	degrees, or your arm straight out, that is where I
8	start having problems. Pain and very limited. I
9	can't get more than 15 pounds above my head.
10	I wanted to go back to work. We have
11	been trying at physical therapy to get this weight
12	and whatever and I just can't get it.
13	On top of that, I do have some of the
14	numbness in my biceps area has finally gone away
15	but on top of my shoulder is so sensitive.
16	I can't wear an airpack, a backpack, a
17	scuba tank which was one of my hobbies.
18	So I also have like three screw heads
19	popping out of my skin. I am kind of limited.
20	Pretty much above my shoulder line it is kind of
21	game over. I have a 15-pound limit that Dr. Cole
22	said is probably going to be the best I can do.
23	Q Since you went on layup, have you engaged
24	in any activities by which you earn income?

1 Α I do. I have, yes. 2 What is that? What activities do you Q 3 engage in? It is an Administrative Assistant for the 4 Α 5 Village of Crestwood with the Fire Department. Just doing payroll, anything desk. Answering 6 7 phones. That is pretty much --8 It is not a job that requires you to Q 9 engage in heavy physical lifting as you did when 10 you were working as a firefighter; is that correct? 11 No. Negative. The heaviest thing is a Α 12 water bottle, that is all. 13 All right. Have you engaged in any Q 14 sporting activities? 15 Α No. Negative. 16 Do you currently have any appointments Q 17 with physicians with respect to your left shoulder 18 condition? I do not, no. They said this was 19 Α 20 probably going to be about as good as I get. Same 21 with the elbow. I am still having pain with the elbow but nothing that limits me so that is the 22 23 same situation. They think that is just going to 24 be how it's going to be. Nerve -- you know, nerve

1 issues here and there. Just that is about it so. 2 MR. PINELLI: Okay. Thank you. That is 3 all the questions I have. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: 4 Trustees, any 5 questions? 6 No questions. 7 MR. PINELLI: I would call Dr. Samo to 8 testify. 9 (Witness previously sworn.) 10 DANIEL SAMO, M.D. 11 a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows: 12 13 EXAMINATION BY MR. PINELLI: 14 15 Q Sir, please state your name. 16 Α Daniel Samo. 17 Q You're a physician, correct? 18 Α Yes. 19 A copy of your qualifications are Q 20 attached to the Board Exhibits? 21 Α Yes. 22 Do you perform a function for this fund? Q 23 Α Yes. 24 In that capacity, do you review medical Q

1 records, examine applicants or interview them and 2 report your findings to the Board? 3 Α Yes. Did you file a written report with the 4 Q Board that is marked as Board Exhibit Number 2? 5 6 Α Yes. 7 Doctor, you interviewed the applicant; is Q 8 that correct? 9 Α Yes, I did. And was the information he provided to 10 Q 11 you during the interview consistent with the medical records you reviewed? 12 13 He did not tell him me about his issues Α 14 prior to the incident. 15 Q You are talking about with his left 16 shoulder? 17 Α Correct. 18 Doctor, did you send the applicant out Q 19 for an independent medical exam? 20 Yes, I did. Α 21 And to whom did you send him to? Q Dr. Samuel Biafora, who is a shoulder and 22 Α 23 upper extremity specialist, orthopedic. 24 He is an orthopedic surgeon? Q

1	A Correct.
2	Q Why did you do that?
3	A I wanted someone to look at him,
4	especially to look at his imaging, to see if there
5	was any changes in the images from before and after
6	the incident and to get an opinion about any
7	changes in his condition before and after the
8	incident.
9	Q Okay. Is Dr. Biafora, to your knowledge,
10	a doctor that has been approved by the Board to
11	conduct independent medical exams?
12	A Yes, he is.
13	Q He did conduct that examination?
14	A Yes, he did.
15	Q Did he file a written report that is
16	marked as Board Exhibit 2B?
17	A He did.
18	Q Can you just summarize for us what his
19	findings were with respect to his independent
20	medical exam?
21	A His findings were that when he compared
22	the imaging there was really no significant change
23	in the imaging of the shoulder. He felt that based
24	on his subjective complaints of increased pain and

1 decreased range of motion that his shoulder 2 condition had worsened subjectively due to the 3 incident. So that even if he had a preexisting 4 Q 5 problem in that left shoulder, the incident on March 31, 2020 exacerbated that condition? 6 7 Α Yes. In his opinion is he currently unable to 8 Q 9 perform his duties with the Fire Department? 10 Α Yes, he is. 11 Doctor, do you agree with those findings? Q 12 Α Yes. 13 MR. PINELLI: Thank you, that is all the 14 questions I have. 15 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustees, any 16 questions for Dr. Samo? 17 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: No questions. 18 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, I would like to make a motion to grant the benefits 19 requested by Firefighter EMT Ryan Ray. 20 21 MEMBER TEBBENS: Second. 22 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion to 23 grant by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Tebbens. 24

1 Trustee Murphy. 2 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 3 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 4 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 5 6 Conyears-Ervin. 7 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 8 9 MEMBER SONI: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. 10 11 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 12 13 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Valencia. 14 MEMBER VALENCIA: Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 16 17 Motion carries. 18 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, I'd like 19 to make a motion for reexam consistent with the 20 Board's policy. 21 MEMBER SONI: Second. 22 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There's a motion for 23 reexam by Trustee Murphy. 1 Trustee Murphy. 2 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 3 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 4 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 5 6 Conyears-Ervin. 7 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. CENITI a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was 10 examined and testified as follows: 11 12 EXAMINATION 13 BY MR. PINELLI: 14 Sir, please state your name for the Q 15 record. 16 Α Stefan Ceniti. 17 Q What is your rank with the Fire 18 Department? 19 Paramedic in Charge. Α 20 Q What was your last assignment before you 21 went on layup? 22 Α Ambulance 51. 23 Q Sir, did you receive a copy of the board exhibits marked 1 through 12 in advance of this 24

1 hearing from the Fund staff? 2 Α Yes. 3 Did you have an opportunity to review Q those exhibits? 4 5 Α Yes. 6 Do you have any objection to their Q 7 admission into this record in support of your 8 application? 9 Α No. 10 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. 11 Mr. Chairman, I move for admission of Board Exhibits 1 through 12 without objection from 12 13 the applicant. 14 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Admitted without 15 objection. 16 (Board Exhibits 1 through 12 were 17 admitted into the record.) 18 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. 19 BY MR. PINELLI: Mr. Ceniti, directing your attention to 20 Q 21 October 9th of 2020 is that the day on which you 22 sustained an injury or injuries that are the basis 23 of your application? 24 Α Yes.

1 Understanding that the Board does have Q 2 your written statement, could you still briefly 3 summarize for us where you were and what happened to you on that date? 4 5 Α Yes. On October 9, 2020 when sitting in 6 the front passenger seat, Chicago Fire Department 7 Ambulance 51, we were parked with lights on documenting a refusal. 8 9 The ambulance was T-boned on the 10 passenger side by an intoxicated driver causing 11 pain to my neck and shoulder with numbness to my right hand. 12 13 I was transported to Little Company of 14 Mary ER where I received x-rays of the right arm. 15 Released the same day. I followed up with CFD 16 Medical and sent to physical therapy. With no 17 relief, pain actually getting worse, CFD sent me 18 for a MRI of neck and a CT of right shoulder. Neck revealed I had a broken neck of 19 20 C-4/C-5 that needed surgery. I had surgery on the 25th of January, 2021 of fusion C-4/C-5 surgery 21 22 done by Dr. Lopez. 23 After months of therapy, I was still 24 experiencing neck and shoulder pain. Unable to

-	
1	lift weight. Having trouble with no position or
2	comfort.
3	Dr. Garrigues suggested I have a MRI of
4	the right shoulder where tears were found not seen
5	in the initial CT scan. I had surgery on the 13th
6	of September, 2021 at Rush by Dr. Garrigues.
7	I am still experiencing pain down the
8	right side of my neck into my right arm and it gets
9	worse upon rotation or lifting objects while
10	lifting away from body. Having pain mostly when
11	standing or sitting for long periods of time. Neck
12	and arm pain with no position or comfort.
13	Q Thank you.
14	A To clarify, Dr. Lopez released me on July
15	3, 2021 so I could have shoulder surgery while I
16	was on a 15 to 20-pound weight restriction.
17	Tomorrow is my 30th year anniversary with
18	the Chicago Fire Department. I am currently third
19	on the Ambulance Commander list.
20	I never anticipated to be here today but
21	circumstances being what they are here I am.
22	Thank you.
23	Q Thank you for that detail. Let me just
24	backup, with respect to the condition of your right

1 shoulder and neck area prior to this incident, had 2 you ever had any injuries to those areas of your 3 body? 4 Never, no. Α 5 Q You mentioned that return to work but did you ever actually return to full unrestricted duty 6 7 in between the two surgeries? 8 No. Α 9 Following the second surgery, did you Q 10 undergo some physical therapy in an attempt to return to work? 11 12 I am still in therapy as we speak. Α 13 Okay, thank you. Since you went on layup Q 14 have you engaged in any activities by which you 15 earn income? 16 Α No. 17 Q Have you engaged in any sporting 18 activities? 19 Α No. 20 Q Are you currently taking any medications prescribed by a physician for pain management? 21 22 No. But that is my choice because I have Α 23 a history of kidney cancer so I refuse to take medicine. 24

1 MR. PINELLI: Thank you, sir, that is all 2 the questions I have. 3 MR. CENITI: Thank you. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: 4 Trustees, any 5 questions? 6 No questions. 7 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. Then I will 8 proceed to Dr. Peters. 9 (Witness previously sworn.) MICHAEL I. PETERS, M.D. 10 11 a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows: 12 13 EXAMINATION BY MR. PINELLI: 14 15 Q Sir, could you please state your name? 16 Α Michael I. Peters. 17 Q You're a physician; is that correct? 18 Α Yes. 19 A copy of your qualifications as a Q physician are attached to the Board Exhibits? 20 21 Yes, it is. Α 22 Do you perform a function as a consultant Q 23 to this Pension Fund? 24 Yes, I do. Α

1 In that capacity, do you review medical Q 2 records, examine or interview applicants, and 3 report to the Board? Yes, I do. 4 Α Did you file a written report with the 5 Q Board that is marked as Board Exhibit Number 2? 6 7 Α Yes. 8 Doctor, did you interview the applicant Q due to Covid restrictions? 9 Yes, I did. 10 Α 11 Did you find that his answers with Q 12 respect to your interview were consistent or 13 inconsistent with the medical records that you had 14 reviewed? 15 Α Some of his description of his medical 16 course is inconsistent with the medical record I 17 reviewed. We did discuss some of that on the 18 phone. 19 Those inconsistencies, do they affect Q your opinions in this case? 20 21 My opinion is based on his medical Α 22 record, not on his understanding of his medical 23 care. 24 Okay. Let's get to your opinion. Q With

1	respect to his current condition, could you
2	describe it for us?
3	A Yes. So he, as he described, was an
4	unrestrained front seat passenger in a parked
5	ambulance struck at high speed by a T-bone
6	mechanism to his side, passenger side.
7	He had his right arm resting on the arm
8	rest. He was completing a medical record for
9	refusal, I think. He had an immediate onset of
10	neck and right shoulder pain.
11	He ultimately underwent a microdiscectomy
12	surgery of his cervical spine at $C-4/5$. And the
13	reason why that was done is he developed weakness
14	of the right upper extremity so he definitely had
15	clinical findings of disc disease but he had
16	underlying diffuse degenerative disc disease. It
17	certainly didn't occur from the crash. You could
18	argue that the crash made things worse and he had
19	the surgery for that reason.
20	I did not see evidence of a fracture of
21	his cervical spine as he described in his
22	testimony.
23	Ultimately, his physician Dr. Lopez
24	cleared him in writing as being at MMI for his

1	cervical spine and cleared him to return to full
2	duties. The 20-pound lifting restriction was
3	actually waived. This was also noted by the
4	advance practice provider, Ms. Daly, at the CFD,
5	when he followed up there.
6	So I know he explained to me that the
7	reason why Dr. Lopez did that was so he could be
8	cleared for right shoulder surgery but the medical
9	record is pretty clear that Dr. Lopez clearing him
10	for right shoulder surgery and putting him at MMI
11	as it relates to his neck surgery were really two
12	different topics of Dr. Lopez' note.
13	And then the right shoulder injury, yes,
14	there were tears seen on the MRI but those were not
15	surgical tears and they weren't repaired
16	surgically.
17	When he had the surgery, he had the
18	surgery for chronic degenerative AC joint
19	arthropathy or arthritis, that is what the surgery
20	was.
21	The surgeon described the indication as
22	endstage arthropathy and the arthropathy findings
23	did not justify any type of rotator cuff repair.
24	Q Given that condition, the current

1 condition of his shoulder, do you believe he could 2 perform his duties with the Fire Department? 3 Α Well, I think he's cleared as with regards to his neck. I don't really have good 4 5 objective evidence of what he can do with his shoulder, other than what he's telling me. I think 6 7 he would need probably a FCE or some other --8 short of me examining him, I think we need to know how much he can lift. 9 That hasn't been determined, nobody has 10 Q 11 put a restriction on that? 12 I don't know the answer to that. For me, Α 13 I would have to see what he can do in a FCE. He's 14 reporting a lot of pain so I would predict that he 15 probably can't do the lifting required of a 16 Paramedic. 17 Q Let's return for a moment to the cause of 18 his current condition. You heard his testimony that he did not have any prior injury or problems 19 20 with his right shoulder that he was aware of. Is 21 that consistent with what you saw? 22 Α Yes. 23 Clearly the accident -- he didn't Q 24 experience these symptoms until after the accident,

1 that appears clear, right? 2 Α That appears clear. 3 Q So could the accident have aggravated -if he did have underlying osteoarthritis in that 4 5 right shoulder joint, could it have exacerbated that? 6 7 It could have. Α 8 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. That is all the 9 questions I have of the doctor. 10 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustees, any 11 questions? 12 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: No questions. 13 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Hearing none. 14 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, I'd like 15 to make a motion to grant the benefits requested by 16 Ambulance Paramedic Ceniti. 17 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Second. 18 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion to grant by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by McPhillips. 19 20 Trustee Murphy. 21 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 22 23 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 24

1 Conyears-Ervin. 2 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 3 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. MEMBER SONI: Yes. 4 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. 6 7 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 8 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Valencia. MEMBER VALENCIA: Yes. 10 11 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. Motion carries. 12 13 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, I would like to make a motion for reexam consistent with 14 15 the Board's policy. MEMBER SONI: Second. 16 17 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion for 18 reexam by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee 19 Soni. 20 Trustee Murphy. 21 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 22 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 23 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 24

1 Conyears-Ervin. 2 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 3 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. MEMBER SONI: Yes. 4 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. 6 7 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 8 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Valencia. MEMBER VALENCIA: Yes. 10 11 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. Motion carries. 12 13 MEMBER MURPHY: Counsel has previously 14 sent around proposed Findings of Fact and 15 Conclusions of Law. Having had an opportunity to 16 review those, I make a motion to adopt the Findings 17 of Fact and Conclusions of Law in this matter. 18 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There's a motion by 19 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Sheridan. 20 21 Trustee Murphy. 22 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 23 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 24

1 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 2 Conyears-Ervin. 3 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: 4 Trustee Soni. 5 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 6 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. 7 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 9 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 10 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Valencia. 11 MEMBER VALENCIA: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 12 13 Motion carries. 14 Based on the Findings of Fact and 15 Conclusions of Law made by the Trustees, the 16 Trustees have voted to grant you the benefit you 17 have requested. 18 You will be notified by mail of the Findings of Fact and the Board's decision. 19 20 Thank you and good luck to you. 21 MR. CENITI: Thank you. I appreciate it, 22 everybody. 23 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, our next 24 applicant Cornelius Graves has asked to defer per

1 counsel. 2 MS. BURNS: You need a motion to defer 3 Mr. Graves' application for Duty disability based 4 on his request. MEMBER MURPHY: Motion to defer. 5 MEMBER TEBBENS: Second. 6 7 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Motion to defer by 8 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Tebbens. 9 Trustee Murphy. MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 10 11 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 12 13 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Conyears-Ervin. 14 15 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 16 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 17 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 18 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee McPhillips. 19 MEMBER MCPHILLIPS: Yes. 20 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 21 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Valencia. 22 MEMBER VALENCIA: Yes. 23 24 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes.

1 Motion carries. 2 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, moving on 3 to our next applicant Robert Cook, Lieutenant EMT. MR. PINELLI: Lieutenant Cook, are you 4 5 online? 6 MR. COOK: Yes, I am. 7 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. Let the record reflect this is a hearing 8 9 on the application for a Duty Disability benefit 10 being made by Lieutenant Robert Cook. 11 Good morning, Mr. Cook. As you have been told, I am one of the attorneys for the Pension 12 13 Fund. I will be conducting this hearing. 14 For the record, I want to advise you of 15 some preliminary matters before we start the actual 16 evidence. 17 First of all, there are seven trustees 18 currently present to hear the evidence on your 19 application. If you don't know you should know the 20 Pension Code requires that you get the yes vote of at least five trustees in order to receive this 21 22 benefit. Do you understand that? 23 MR. COOK: Yes, I do. 24 MR. PINELLI: I see from the record that

1	there is not an attorney that has filed an
2	appearance to represent you in this matter. Is it
3	your desire to proceed without an attorney?
4	MR. COOK: Yes, it is.
5	MR. PINELLI: Lastly, it is the
6	applicant's burden of proof to present sufficient
7	evidence to the Board in order for the Board to
8	grant the benefit to the applicant under the
9	Pension Code. Do you understand that?
10	MR. COOK: Yes, I do.
11	MR. PINELLI: By way of procedures, I am
12	going to start by asking you some questions under
13	oath. The board members may or may not have
14	questions of you. Then I will call the Fund's
15	physician consultant to testify. If there is
16	anything I don't ask him that you think is
17	important for the Board to know, please let me know
18	and you will be given that opportunity. Do you
19	understand the procedures?
20	MR. COOK: Yes, I do.
21	MR. PINELLI: Sir, could you please raise
22	your right hand? Dr. Peters, also raise your right
23	hand.
24	(Witnesses sworn.)

1 ROBERT E. COOK 2 a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was 3 examined and testified as follows: EXAMINATION 4 BY MR. PINELLI: 5 State your name for the record. 6 Q 7 My name is Robert Cook. Α 8 What is your current rank with the Fire Q 9 Department? I am a Lieutenant EMT and before going on 10 Α 11 medical layup I was assigned to 6-5-2. 12 Directing your attention to the group of Q 13 Board Exhibits, were you provided a copy of those 14 exhibits in advance of today's hearing? 15 Α Yes, I was. 16 Do you have any objection to their Q 17 admission into the record? 18 Α No, I don't. 19 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. 20 Mr. Chairman, I move for admission of 21 Board Exhibits 1 through 14 without objection from 22 the applicant. 23 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Admitted without 24 objection.

1 (Board Exhibits 1 through 14 were 2 admitted into evidence.) 3 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. BY MR. PINELLI: 4 5 Q Now, sir, directing your attention to the date of October 28th of 2020 is that the date on 6 7 which you sustained an injury or injuries that is the basis of your application? 8 9 Α Yes, it is. 10 Understanding that the Board does have a Q 11 copy of your written statement, could you just briefly summarize for us, if you would, where you 12 13 were and what happened to you on that date? 14 I went over to the rear of Engine 127 and Α 15 we were going to pull out everything inside the 16 compartment. So as I reached in I pulled out a 17 lifejacket and I handed it to Firefighter Herrera. 18 Then I reached in and pulled out a second lifejacket and handed it to Firefighter Herrera. 19 20 When I reached in the compartment a third time, which I thought was a bag containing the rest of 21 22 the lifejackets that the Engine 127 had in their 23 inventory, it felt a little stuck so I pulled it a 24 little harder.

1 When I pulled it out, as it came clear of 2 the compartment, which is right below the hose bed 3 so it is maybe I quess like forehead head. I was holding with my right arm extended. As I pulled it 4 5 out, I realized it was not lifejackets. It was something quite heavy. 6 7 As it came clear, I tried to pull it to my body to get my second arm around it. It was 8 9 just too heavy. I couldn't hold it that long and 10 it just pulled me to the ground. 11 As I went to the ground -- I mean, I 12 didn't fall to the ground. Like it pulled my upper 13 body. Like bending over. Like going to my knees. 14 I let go of the bag once it hit the ground and I 15 stood up. 16 Everybody was there because it was still 17 part of the roll call procedure. 18 I just stood there. I believe -- I want 19 to say Captain Rogers took over completing what we 20 were doing. 21 While we were talking, he was continuing 22 what we were going over; the drill/roll call. 23 He asked me if I was okay because I was 24 kind of moving funny standing there. After about

1	five or ten minutes, I forget how long it was, I
2	asked if I could be excused or he may have told me
3	I could be excused. I went and took a couple of
4	Ibuprofens. I thought I maybe strained something.
5	A couple hours later, I don't know the
6	exact time, I took a third Ibuprofen. I realized
7	that wasn't helping so I went to Captain Rogers. I
8	told him I'd like to go to the hospital to get
9	checked out.
10	I went to the hospital. They did some
11	x-rays. They told me that I don't know the
12	medical terms. It is in the medical records.
13	Something with my back. It was I don't know
14	what the name of it is. Anyway, they told me I had
15	to go see a back specialist.
16	The shoulder I didn't realize how much it
17	was hurt because the back hurt a lot more than the
18	shoulder. The shoulder was very sore but the back
19	was the majority of my pain. That kind of
20	concludes what happened that day.
21	Q When you say your back, which part of
22	your back was causing you pain?
23	A The lower back. I guess it would be
24	called like the lumbar section going into my right

1 hip more. 2 Okay. Now had you ever had any injuries Q 3 to either your right shoulder or your lower back prior to that date? 4 5 Α The lower back, no, I never had that. The right shoulder I did. In the doctor's report, 6 7 it says ten years ago. It was actually -- I don't know the exact date. It was over 20 years ago. 8 Ι 9 am guessing about 21 years ago. 10 I did have Dr. Lim go in and -- I don't 11 remember exactly. He basically cleaned up the shoulder because there was I guess like some kind 12 13 something in there that was irritating my shoulder. 14 He went in and cleaned up whatever was in 15 there. I don't know the date. It was over 20 16 years ago. After that then the shoulder was fine. 17 Q You never had any problems working full 18 unrestricted duty with your shoulder --19 Α No. 20 Q -- after the procedure? 21 No. And I was very active prior to the Α 22 injury so no. 23 So then let's follow through after you Q 24 went on layup. Did you ultimately have a surgery

1 on your right shoulder in January? 2 I did two surgeries. Yes, I am sorry. Α 3 That is okay. The first surgery was in Q January of 2021? 4 5 Α Correct. Tell us about after that surgery, were 6 Q 7 you able to get back or what happened? 8 No. After the surgery, at first it Α 9 seemed okay. Once we started to try to get 10 movements -- I had range of motion but I couldn't 11 do certain things. Certain motions I just couldn't 12 do. 13 So I spoke to Mary Daly about it at 14 Medical and I spoke to my physical therapist. The 15 physical therapist, after it was not responding, 16 told me, yeah, you might need to look into 17 something else. 18 During this process, I went back to the doctor who did the surgery. I think it was 19 probably a couple of months in my rehab and he 20 tried giving me like a steroid injection. It did 21 22 relieve the pain for maybe a month but it didn't 23 get any better. Then we continued, the same 24 problems.

1 Then eventually he gave me a second 2 injection. After the second injection, it actually 3 was getting degeneratively worse to the point where I couldn't -- the motion I had before was actually 4 I couldn't even do that now. 5 I was telling him the whole time I 6 7 thought something was wrong. I was frustrated that 8 I should be healing. It should be getting better. 9 Finally, after six months, he said now we 10 waited six months, we can do another MRI. Went to the second MRI and he said that we had to redo the 11 12 surgery. I take that back. After the second MRI, 13 he gave me the second steroid injection. Then we redid -- he wanted to redo the 14 15 surgery and I chose not to have him do it because I 16 wasn't happy with the way he was treating me after 17 the surgery. 18 So I went and I saw a second surgeon at Rush Midwest Orthopedics, Dr. Garrigues, and he 19 20 repeated the surgery. It will be four weeks ago 21 this Friday. 22 He removed the four screws from the first 23 surgery. He replaced it with four new screws. I 24 want to say I think it is a cadaver tendon. He had

1 to put something else in there to reattach 2 something to make -- because I tore the rotator off 3 the bone the first time. That is pretty much it. I don't know 4 about all the medical terms after that. 5 So that second surgery was October 22nd 6 Q 7 or thereabouts of this year? 8 Yes. Yes. Α 9 Several weeks ago. Have you been able to Q 10 engage in physical therapy since the surgery? 11 Yes, I did. He had me start physical Α 12 therapy about ten days ago. 13 Can you tell the board members what the Q 14 current condition of your right shoulder is with 15 respect to any pain or limitations at this time? 16 I am still in an arm sling for about Α 17 another -- I want to say maybe two or three weeks I 18 go back to see him. I think the 28th of this month. I am not sure of the date. It is at the 19 end of the month, last couple of days. And then at 20 21 that point he is going to look at me and decide if 22 I can come out of the sling and then start having 23 limited time out of the sling or stay in the sling 24 longer.

1 Physical therapy is very minimal. A11 2 they are trying to do is like straighten out my 3 arm. Move it back to try to keep some range of motion with the therapist holding. Otherwise, it 4 5 is just pretty much wait and see. They are being very cautious just because the first surgery didn't 6 7 turn out well and we definitely don't want to do 8 this a third time. They are being very cautious. 9 Since you went on layup, have you engaged Q 10 in any activity by which you earn income? 11 Α No. 12 Q Have you engaged in any sporting 13 activities? 14 Α No. 15 MR. PINELLI: Thank you, that is all the 16 questions I have of the applicant. 17 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustees, any 18 questions? 19 Hearing none, Vince. 20 MR. PINELLI: Mr. Chairman, I see in the 21 Board exhibits there are listed a couple of 22 witnesses. Are there any on the line? Either EMT 23 Captain Michael Rogers or Firefighter Angelo Herrera. Are either of those gentlemen on the 24

1 line? 2 MS. BURNS: Mr. Herrera, are you on the 3 phone? 4 Captain Rogers are you on the phone? It is always problematic when witnesses 5 are subpoenaed and don't show up. Unless the 6 7 applicant cares, you could proceed, Vince, with Dr. 8 Peters. 9 MR. PINELLI: Why don't I do that while 10 they are checking with Lori on the witness 11 availability. 12 Mr. Cook, do you mind if I go ahead and 13 call Dr. Peters to testify? 14 MR. COOK: No, I don't. 15 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. 16 (Witness previously sworn.) 17 Michael I. Peters, M.D. 18 a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was 19 examined and testified as follows: 20 EXAMINATION 21 BY MR. PINELLI: 22 Sir, please state your name. Q 23 Α Michael I. Peters. 24 You are a physician; is that correct? Q

1 Α Yes. 2 Are a copy of your qualifications Q 3 attached to the Board exhibits? 4 Α Yes. 5 Q Do you perform a function as a consultant to this Fund? 6 7 Α Yes, I do. 8 In that capacity, do you review medical Q 9 records, examine applicants and report to the Board? 10 11 Α Yes. 12 Or interview them due to Covid protocols. Q 13 Did you file a written report with the Board that is marked as Board Exhibit Number 2? 14 15 Α Yes, I did. 16 Dr. Peters, could you briefly summarize Q 17 for us the current state of his condition and what 18 his history is leading up to that? 19 Lieutenant Cook, as he described, was Α removing lighter items/equipment from an overhead 20 21 compartment. But then by mistake he didn't realize 22 that there was a much heavier bag and he sustained 23 two injuries as a result of that. The first was a 24 tear of his right -- part of his right rotator

1	cuff, the supraspinatus tendon, which ultimately
2	required operative repair.
3	It sounds like from his history he
4	probably had a retear of that in the immediate
5	postoperative period, based on some conditioning
6	that he was put in passively of his arm.
7	Either way, he continued to have
8	postoperative pain and ultimately as he described
9	had resurgery on October 22nd. Where it was noted
10	intraoperatively that he had a retear of his
11	supraspinatus tendon that required and,
12	actually, the tendon was retracted, pulled back.
13	So he had a repair of that a second time with a
14	cadaver tendon. He's not really even very far into
15	his rehabilitation for that retear injury.
16	From the lifting incident on-duty, he
17	also had low back pain radiating to his right leg
18	so he had a right lumbar radiculopathy. And failed
19	conservative therapy, which included three epidural
20	steroid injections at his SI joint.
21	He then had a microdiscectomy at L-4/5
22	but he hasn't had that much improvement. He is
23	still having right lumbar radiculopathy.
24	Further interventions for that injury

1 were put on hold so he could get his shoulder --2 have his second shoulder surgery. He still has a 3 problem with his low back and radiating symptoms and he hasn't completed all of the treatment that 4 5 he might get. Based upon that, would he be able to 6 Q perform his duties at this time? 7 8 Α No, he can't. 9 MR. PINELLI: Thank you, doctor, that is all the questions I have. 10 11 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustees, any 12 questions? 13 Hearing none. MEMBER MURPHY: Do we have any other 14 15 witnesses? 16 MS. BURNS: We have been told that one of 17 the subpoenaed witnesses is not able to make it due 18 to a doctor's appointment. The second subpoenaed witness did not 19 respond to the Fund's outreach. 20 21 And, therefore, unless Mr. Cook prefers 22 not to proceed, I think you could proceed with 23 maybe direction to Lori to follow up with those witnesses and tell them that they have to respond. 24

1 Mr. Cook, based on the evidence as 2 presented, it is your option if you would like to 3 proceed or defer this matter until next month at which time we will endeavor to get the two 4 5 witnesses to attend and give testimony. Is it your 6 desire to proceed? 7 MR. COOK: Yes, it is. 8 MS. BURNS: Thank you, sir. 9 MEMBER MURPHY: I would like to make a 10 motion to grant the benefits requested by EMT 11 Lieutenant Cook. COOK: 7 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, last month we heard testimony and evidence related to the Duty 8 9 Disability application made by John L. Tuggle. At 10 that time the Board voted to deny Firefighter 11 Tuggle's application for Duty Disability benefits. 12 Counsel has now provided us with written 13 Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in the 14 matter. 15 Having had a chance an opportunity to 16 review, I'd like to make a motion to adopt the 17 Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in this 18 matter. MEMBER TEBBENS: Second. 19 20 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Motion by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Tebbens. 21 22 Trustee Murphy. 23 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 24 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan.

1 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 2 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 3 Conyears-Ervin. MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 4 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. MEMBER SONI: Yes. 6 7 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 9 10 Motion carries. 11 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, our next matter involves the child annuity applications 12 13 filed by Antonia Pickering, on behalf of the minor 14 children of Michael R. Pickering. This is a Covid 15 related duty death matter. 16 MR. PINELLI: Thank you, Mr. Secretary. 17 Let the record reflect this is a hearing 18 on the application for child annuity benefits for Zoey Pickering and Ella Pickering being made on 19 20 their behalf by their mother Antonia Pickering, 21 wife of deceased EMT Michael Pickering. 22 At this time, Mr. Chairman, I move for 23 admission of Board Exhibits 1 through 7 into the record in this matter. 24

1 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Exhibits admitted 2 without objection. (Board Exhibits 1 through 7 were 3 admitted into evidence.) 4 5 MR. PINELLI: Thank you. To summarize for the Trustees, those 6 7 exhibits just admitted into the record, basically, indicate that Zoey and Ella Pickering are in fact 8 9 the children of Firefighter EMT Michael Pickering. 10 They are of the ages of 17 and 15, based upon the 11 birth certificates. 12 Firefighter EMT Michael Pickering died on 13 October 8th of 2021. The death certificate 14 indicating the immediate cause of death was 15 respiratory failure, pneumonia and COVID-19 viral 16 infection. 17 The records also indicate that the Office 18 of the Fire Commissioner gathered all available 19 information, conducted an analysis of that 20 information regarding his work assignments, and came to the conclusion that he was exposed to 21 22 COVID-19 while working on-duty and that the virus 23 contributed to his death. That is contained in the 24 exhibits as well.

1 Board Exhibit 5 also indicates that there 2 were various contact tracing done by the Chicago 3 Fire Department to identify potential exposures 4 that Firefighter Pickering had and they were able 5 to document at least two duty runs on which he was exposed to patients who had COVID-19. He was also 6 7 exposed at the firehouse to other individuals who had flulike symptoms as well. 8 9 Based upon those records, I believe there 10 is sufficient evidence in this record before the 11 Board to find that the application meets the requirements of Section 6-148A of the Pension Code, 12 13 which indicates that a child annuity shall be made 14 to children under the age of 18 when a Firemen's 15 death results from the performance of an act or 16 acts of duty. 17 So that is the evidence before you and 18 the statutory provisions before you. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: 19 Thank you, Vince. 20 MEMBER MURPHY: I'd like to make a motion 21 to grant the child annuity benefits for the minor children of Michael R. Pickering. 22 23 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. 24 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion by

1 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Sheridan. 2 Trustee Murphy. 3 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 8 9 MEMBER SONI: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 10 11 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 12 13 Motion carries. 14 MEMBER MURPHY: Moving on, Mr. President, 15 I'd like to make a motion to approve the Board 16 Physician's recommendations for reviews of the 17 disability recipients. 18 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. 19 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion for 20 review by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee 21 Sheridan. 22 Trustee Murphy. MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 23 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 24

1 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 2 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 3 Conyears-Ervin. MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 4 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. MEMBER SONI: Yes. 6 7 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 9 Motion carries. 10 11 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, our next item is Investment. I will turn this issue over to 12 13 Lorna. 14 MS. SCOTT: So for the investment report 15 I am going to just highlight performance and then 16 plan on going into more detail on the reports that 17 are in BoardPac at an Investment Committee meeting 18 to be held sometime in early December. It is a reminder, we do want to have an 19 20 Investment Committee meeting before the December board meeting in order to fully discuss the results 21 22 of that Asset Liability Study, with the plan to 23 adopt the new asset allocation at the December 24 board meeting.

1 Regarding that Asset Liability Study, it 2 is a reminder that Brady and I are really open to 3 feedback on this. You heard an initial presentation from Brady at last month's board 4 5 meeting. President Fortuna did ask us to cover how 6 7 the MWDBE allocation would be impacted by the proposed asset allocation so we will be addressing 8 9 that topic at the Investment Committee meeting in 10 December. 11 Please let us know if there are any other concerns or topics you'd like to be discussed and I 12 13 will be reaching out to schedule an Investment 14 Committee meeting for early December. 15 Performance highlights. Markets 16 rebounded in October. The Fund was up 2.8 percent 17 in the month and that brings our year-to-date total 18 to 13.9 percent. The Fund did underperform the benchmark by about 0.5 percent in October but it 19 20 remains ahead for the year-to-date outperforming the benchmark by 0.4 percent. 21 22 Most of that outperformance is primarily 23 due to strong performance by our international 24 equity managers.

1 Then with that, I think that is 2 performance and investment in a nutshell and I will 3 turn it over to Jackie for some insight on our operating cash. 4 5 MS. VLAHOS: Like we have discussed before, this has been a really great year for us 6 7 with the new funding in place. So as of November 12th, we currently have \$70.9 million in our Chase 8 9 account. We are anticipating the salary 10 contributions, one more before the end of the month, of approximately \$1.85 million bringing us 11 to a total available cash of \$72.7 million dollars. 12 13 We have our benefits for November. After 14 we pay our benefit payments, our refunds, our 15 office payables, it bring us to approximately 16 \$35 million in monthly payments for November. 17 Leaving us a remainder of an overage of 18 \$37.9 million dollars. Which is great news because that can carry us through December payments, that 19 will cover us for the next month. 20 21 If you go to the next page, due to our 22 cash flow projections, you can see as we just 23 discussed, we don't need any draw downs in order to 24 pay our monthly payments for November. As well as

1 in December, even though we're anticipating the 2 \$9.5 million in tax receipts, as you can see in the 3 first column. Even without that, we still will have 4 5 enough money. Let's say we get zero dollars in December, we still have enough money to cover us 6 7 through December. 8 It is very usual and customary for us to 9 draw in January just for the fact that usually 10 January is a month where we get little to no tax 11 receipts. 12 For the next month, we will have this 13 spreadsheet updated to be reflecting the 2023 cash 14 flow projections as well. 15 Does anyone have any questions? MS. BURNS: There doesn't seem to be any 16 questions, Jackie. 17 18 MS. VLAHOS: Okay, great. Jackie, if we can go out of 19 MR. WELLER: I know the Treasurer has a 10:30 hard stop 20 order. for a meeting that she has. The items that we 21 22 might want to get voted on. 23 Mr. President, would you like us to 24 perhaps go out of order?

1 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Yes. I reflect that 2 we go out of order to take care of anything that we 3 need to vote on. MR. WELLER: The first I think most 4 important item is the certification of the 5 election, which falls under the Executive 6 7 Director's Report Item 8A. 8 Let me just do a quick review on this so 9 everybody is on the same page. So we did have an 10 Active Trustee election happening in the fall. We 11 did have a decent turnout on the count of number of 12 votes back in. About 33 percent. A little bit 13 lower than normal, but still a strong showing. The results were Daniel J. Cusack 446. 14 15 Results for Anthony R. Martin 670. Results for 16 Timothy McPhillips 546. Total votes counted 1,662. 17 Everybody has seen the certification from 18 Bansley & Kiener in the BoardPac. With that, I would ask the Board to certify this election as 19 formalized and completed. 20 21 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: I would need a motion for certification. 22 23 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, based on 24 the Executive Director's report provided, I make a

1 motion to certify the 2021 Active Trustee election 2 results. 3 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion by 4 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Sheridan. 5 6 Trustee Murphy. 7 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 9 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 10 11 Conyears-Ervin. 12 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 13 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 14 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 16 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 17 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 18 Motion carries. 19 MR. WELLER: Jackie, to continue back in 20 your vein to cover the open enrollment that we are 21 going to do with employees in November, can you 22 please bring the health employee insurance item up 23 for review and discussion? 24 MS. VLAHOS: I think it is 7C.

1 Here's basically just a quick overview. 2 I know Kelly had mentioned last month that our 3 healthcare is due up for renewal as well as the reason why we are discussing it currently is the 4 5 paperwork is due December 1st. We did actually get really good news as 6 7 you can see in the top portion where it says the \$32,000. Currently our monthly premium is \$32,200 8 9 a month, that is before the employer reimbursement. And what they are proposing, if we stay in the same 10 11 plan, is going to be \$33,456 a month. 12 You're looking at an increase for medical of 3.89 percent, which is actually under what they 13 were projecting for healthcare just in general for 14 15 the country as well as we are on the age based 16 Basically, regardless of any premium plan. 17 increases, we are going to see an increase every 18 year because each year we get a year older in the office our premiums go up 2 to 5 percent. 19 20 If you look down to the next column is 21 the dental. So we have where we actually have a 22 savings where it is currently about \$2,500 a month 23 and it goes down to approximately \$2,300 a month. 24 Bringing us to a total premium of \$34,650 for the

1	current year. For the proposed upcoming year,
2	\$35,790, which is going to be we also have to
3	have at that is for just our premiums. We also
4	have demographic changes so it is proposing for the
5	year to go up to \$429,000 compared to this year of
6	\$415,800.
7	We also have demographic changes. That
8	is basically accounts for new hires, people that
9	are getting off our plan, maybe someone added a
10	person, deleted a person.
11	With our demographic changes, you're
12	looking at for the end of 2020 to be \$398,890 and
13	for the 2022 year it is going to be \$406,342
14	approximately. We are looking at a total increase
15	of 1.9 percent.
16	We can provide more information if you
17	are wanting to see that but I was actually really
18	happy seeing what they were proposing for the
19	actual increase.
20	MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Jackie, I was
21	thinking the same thing as I was looking at this.
22	I mean, the cost of insurance has just skyrocketed.
23	You all must have really worked hard for a 1.9
24	percent increase. The annuitants and beneficiaries

1 really thank you for that. 2 MS. VLAHOS: We have been lucky so far. 3 MEMBER SONI: I agree. MS. BURNS: To be clear, this is just for 4 5 the Fire Fund employees, that is all. MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes, but I was 6 7 just saying the beneficiaries and the annuitants appreciate the dollars saved. 8 MS. BURNS: Yes, I understand. 9 10 MEMBER SONI: I totally agree with the 11 Treasurer because from the benefit standpoint over 12 here, we have seen costs skyrocket. Especially 13 because a lot of the new treatments and procedures 14 that are going on. To be able to keep this at 1.9, 15 the annual growth right now is about 6 to 7 percent 16 and that is with the Kaiser Family Study. So this 17 is amazing and the same benefits as well. 18 MS. VLAHOS: Hopefully, we can continue that. 19 20 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustees, any more 21 discussion? 22 MEMBER MURPHY: Mr. President, I'd like 23 to make a motion to approve the proposed healthcare 24 expenditure for Fund employees for 2022 as

1 presented. 2 MEMBER TEBBENS: Second. 3 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Tebbens. 4 5 Trustee Murphy. MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 6 7 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 8 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 10 Conyears-Ervin. 11 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 12 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 13 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 14 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 16 17 Motion carries. 18 MR. KELLER: Jackie, one more item before 19 we jump off. 1 MEMBER MURPHY: I'd like to make a motion 2 to approve the administrative expenses as they were 3 presented. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. 4 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There's a motion by Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Sheridan. 6 7 Trustee Murphy. 8 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 10 11 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 12 Conyears-Ervin. 13 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 14 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 15 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 16 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 17 18 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 19 Motion carries. MR. KELLER: Again, my apologies for 20 21 getting out of order here. 22 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: That is okay. Before 23 I lose a quorum, I want to get the votes in. 24 MR. WELLER: Let's jump to Item 10A to

1	make sure we get that completed. It is the
2	resolution for the EMWQ for the Retirees, Widows
3	and the Children's Assistance Fund.
4	This year we are asking for \$100,440 to
5	be moved from the FABF Fund to the Gift Fund. That
6	will sponsor 380 \$1,250 gifts for a total of
7	\$475,000.
8	You can see that breakdown. Chris, can
9	you bring that up real quick for us. You can see
10	that breakdown on that page there that Chris is
11	looking at.
12	It would encompass all the widows
13	receiving less than \$1,500 per month, which there
14	are 305 and then 75 children for a total of 380.
15	\$1,250 per Gift Fund and \$475,000 in total and a
16	transfer of \$100,400.
17	With that, I would ask for a motion and a
18	second for this resolution to go forward.
19	MEMBER MURPHY: I'd like to make a motion
20	to approve the transfer of the \$100,440 from the
21	Gift Fund reserve to the Ende Menzer Walsh Quinn
22	Fund for the expressed purposes of providing
23	holiday checks to the Fund's widows and orphans
24	provided to the Board dated today's date.

1 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. 2 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion by 3 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Sheridan. Trustee Murphy. 4 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 6 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 7 8 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 9 Conyears-Ervin. MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 10 11 I don't know if this was mentioned but 12 this is something we have done in previous years. 13 MS. BURNS: Yes, ma'am. 14 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Thank you, Trustee 15 Conyears-Ervin. 16 Trustee Soni. 17 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 18 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 19 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 20 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 21 Motion carries. 22 MR. WELLER: Three more items. I am 23 going to do the two easy ones first and then we will finish with our cyber liability. 24

1 MS. BURNS: You better do that before you 2 lose the Treasurer since she has to vote on it. 3 MR. WELLER: Chris, let's bring in Craig Goesel and his team. 4 5 MS. BURNS: They are going to talk? MR. WELLER: Yes, just to go over the 6 7 proposal real fast. 8 Waiting for him to come on, we do have 9 the board dates that we have laid out, which are 10 Item 8C for next year. 11 These follow our traditional third 12 Wednesday format. There were two dates that we had 13 to move off of that, January and December. You can 14 see those changes. They don't overlap with any of 15 the other fund meetings that will be going on that 16 our co-trustees sit on. 17 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Director Weller, what 18 I would like to do, I would like you to send those dates to all of the Trustees so if there is any 19 20 changes that they may see later in the year, I 21 would like those to be sent to you. 22 We can adopt these but if there is 23 changes down the road we will be open to make those 24 changes.

1 In the past Trustee Conyears- Ervin 2 wanted to make a change that we couldn't and I want 3 to make sure that everybody has the opportunity to look at all the dates, if there is something that 4 5 needs to be changed. We can adopt these dates but I do want to have an open policy about this. 6 7 MR. WELLER: Okay. MS. BURNS: Let's do the Fund holidays, 8 9 too, then we can do one motion. 10 MR. WELLER: The Fund holidays there was 11 some question last meeting about the City of 12 Chicago. We mirrored the City of Chicago holidays. 13 You can see the ones that are asterisked in 14 BoardPac to follow along. There shouldn't be 15 anything here that is inconsistent with what we 16 have done in the past. 17 MEMBER MURPHY: I would like to make a 18 motion to approve the proposed 2022 board meeting dates and the Fund holiday schedule as they were 19 20 presented. 21 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Second. 22 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: There is a motion by 23 Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee 24 Conyears-Ervin.

1 Trustee Murphy. 2 MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 3 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. 4 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 5 6 Conyears-Ervin. 7 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 9 MEMBER SONI: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. 10 11 MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. 12 13 Motion carries. MR. WELLER: That leaves us with the 14 15 cyber liability issue. Craig, are you on now? 16 MR. JEMMI: This is Jake Jemmi. I work 17 with Craig. I just gave him a call. He's having 18 some troubles with connectivity right now. I just 19 resent the link. 20 MR. WELLER: We will go ahead and share 21 it on our end, don't worry. Just hit the 22 highlights. 23 MR. JEMMI: Starting off, we got very 24 favorable terms this year opposed to the cyber

1 markets. 2 If you want to scroll down to Page 4, if 3 you want to quickly read through here, it kind of highlights the trouble the cyber market has been 4 5 going through. Whether it has been claims you have heard about or just premium increases that every 6 7 single person has been getting in their renewals. 8 Like I said, we have favorable terms on 9 the table through a different carrier. The 10 expiring terms came in a lot higher than we 11 expected. 12 If you can scroll down to the premium page, you can kind of knock out those points right 13 14 away. That is Page 6, please. 15 As you see, we are expiring with \$10,400 16 through Beazley. Beazley came in this year at 17 about \$30,000, which is not what you want to see, 18 especially with the low premium you had last year so we went out to market. 19 20 With your nature of operations, we got a lot of declines as expected. But we got very 21 22 favorable terms from Cowbell, which a lot of your 23 associates, whether it is the Policemen's fund or 24 the Cook County funds, we have used Cowbell as kind

1 of a safety net with them. They are written 2 through Obsidian, which is an A minus on the A AM 3 Best Scale, which is someone we prefer to use. 4 They came in right around expiring so we are very 5 happy with those terms there. 6 To scroll down one more, the only 7 difference here, and it is a positive change, is even the retention is going to be lowered. So all 8 9 through and through it is going to be the same limits, the lower retention, for about the same 10 11 price that is expiring. 12 As you see on the third bullet point there, we are definitely going to be recommending 13 14 the Cowbell Option 2 option. 15 If there are any questions on it, but we 16 are very happy with how we made out on this one. 17 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: I know that Craig 18 has joined. I definitely heard his presentation a number of times at this point. 19 20 Good morning and thank you, Jake, for 21 going over it. 22 I don't know if any of the other trustees 23 have questions but I definitely have seen this with 24 our other pension funds and I know that this is the

1	alternative that we have. We do not have many
2	options but I know that you all did go to market
3	for this price. It is what it is at this point.
4	MEMBER SONI: I agree with Madam
5	Treasurer as well.
6	MR. GOESEL: Thank you, Madam Treasurer.
7	Sorry, I was late. I couldn't use my
8	microphone on my computer so I had to be signed in
9	twice.
10	Everything Jake has said is accurate.
11	And, as Madam Treasurer said, Cowbell has been
12	recommended for other pension systems as well.
13	I will make a quick statement that
14	without the advancement of some of the Fund's cyber
15	security protocol, et cetera, that Kelly Weller and
16	your team had executed over the past three, four
17	months, these terms would not have been nearly as
18	favorable.
19	So that is some of the hassle associated
20	with implementing multifactor authentication and
21	some of the email checks and balances that I am
22	sure do impede some of your access to emails and
23	seem to be a headache do improve your cyber
24	security and therefore did improve the pricing.

1 So shout out to Kelly and his team's hard 2 work on advancing that as hasslely as it might seem 3 to the Trustees sometimes. MEMBER SONI: I agree with the Treasurer. 4 5 We have been seeing the same thing on the City To be able to get this kind of rate with 6 side. 7 Cowbell and being the rating that it is, I think it is a good option. 8 9 MEMBER MURPHY: Good job, Kelly and 10 staff. 11 Based on the recommendation of staff, I 12 would like to approve the renewal of the Fund's 13 cyber liability insurance, on the terms 14 presented. 15 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Second. 16 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Motion be Trustee 17 Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Conyears-Ervin. 18 Trustee Murphy. MEMBER MURPHY: Yes. 19 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Sheridan. 20 21 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Yes. CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee 22 23 Conyears-Ervin. 24 MEMBER CONYEARS-ERVIN: Yes.

1 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Soni. 2 MEMBER SONI: Yes. 3 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Trustee Tebbens. MEMBER TEBBENS: Yes. 4 5 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: And I am a yes. Motion carries. 6 7 MR. WELLER: A few more items. 8 Jackie, and Lorna, I am going to defer 9 back to you. I know we had to go a little bit out 10 of order. 11 Lorna, was there anything left in investments that we need to go back on to discuss? 12 13 MS. SCOTT: No, I think we're good, 14 unless there are any questions. Otherwise, again, 15 our investment committee meeting and look to hear 16 from me on scheduling that. I am looking for 17 everyone to participate, not just committee 18 members. MR. WELLER: Just for everyone's 19 20 edification, we are granting two hours of continuing education credit for those investment 21 22 meetings attended by our Board of Trustees. It is 23 a good way to help make the eight hour requirement, 24 which is the last thing I will talk about on my

1	side.
2	Jackie, dovetailing to you, we have only
3	had one open item and that was the Budget. Do you
4	want to talk about the budget items to-date and
5	what our thoughts are for starting the budget
6	process into 2022?
7	MS. VLAHOS: Sure, if you want me to go
8	over it.
9	Year-to-date Budget so far it is under I
10	think 7B. As you can see so far for 2021, we have
11	approximately \$2.9 million in expenditures and
12	we're at about 79.7 percent of our proposed Budget
13	that was approved for 2021.
14	We are hoping to finish slightly under
15	Budget. I think most things are going well and if
16	you look to the very last column, the only one that
17	is kind of sticking out right now as being over
18	budget is the insurance and it's just for the
19	fiduciary insurance. We did not anticipate such a
20	large increase as what we have experienced.
21	Everything else seems to be right on target.
22	We do have a lot of accounts kind of last
23	year where we budgeted they are still significantly
24	under budget just due to the Covid procedures and

1	things like that that are going on. Office
2	supplies, things like that, are still significantly
3	under budget.
4	I am assuming for 2022, we'll start
5	seeing our spending go back to normal as far as
6	training and education, office supplies, things
7	like that. I am hoping that it goes back to the
8	pre-Covid days.
9	We have actually had one meeting so far.
10	Just a real brief overview of what our budget
11	process looks like for 2022. We're starting to
12	reach out to our different departments to kind of
13	get what their thinking as far as the 2022 Budget.
14	As well as I believe in December,
15	correct me if I am wrong, Dan, but they are going
16	to establish the Budget Committee, who that is
17	going to be, what it is going to look like.
18	Then we are looking to get input from the
19	Budget Committee as well once we get our
20	preliminary numbers and then kind of get something
21	in the next December meeting hoping to get a Budget
22	that is pretty like finalized even though we don't
23	usually approve it until January.
24	So we're looking for input. After we

1	meet with the Budget Committee, if they have one,
2	and after the December meeting, myself and Kelly
3	and anyone else that wants to be involved, we would
4	like to meet with individual trustees to kind of go
5	over it with a fine tooth comb. If there are any
6	other additional questions or any input as far as
7	what they'd like to see or what they might have
8	problems with. So we can get everything situated
9	and discussed before the January meeting comes up.
10	MR. WELLER: That is exactly what I
11	wanted to convey. We're starting the process. We
12	are going to meet as trustees want to individually,
13	scheduling times, but we want to have some concrete
14	numbers with which to bring forward.
15	And we will have that I anticipate by
16	maybe not the next board meeting but within the
17	holiday season so look for that.
18	The other thing I just wanted to let the
19	board know, we have started our audit for 2021. We
20	have got Mitchell Titus who came in now for one
21	initial setup meeting. We got them coming in next
22	month for another pre-audit meeting so we're
23	addressing the issues that might have slowed us
24	down a little last year and making sure that we got

1 corrected procedures in place. I am very hopeful 2 that we will have a smooth and good audit 3 experience this year. MEMBER SONI: May I ask a question about 4 5 that? Do they have the same team on board as last 6 year or do they have new key personnel? 7 MR. WELLER: Trustee Soni, it is the same personnel. It is Kenny and Gary. I think they did 8 9 add a new person from the testing team. I have not 10 met that person yet but Gary and Kenny have been 11 leading our conversations to this point and so far 12 we have had very clear communication and 13 expectation. 14 MEMBER SONI: Thank you. 15 MEMBER MURPHY: I think that wraps up the 16 Executive Director's Report. 17 I think the only thing we have open is 18 legal update with counsel. 19 MS. BURNS: There is nothing to report, 20 sir. 21 MEMBER MURPHY: I'd like make a motion to 22 adjourn. 23 MEMBER SHERIDAN: Second. 24 CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: Motion to adjourn by

1	Trustee Murphy. Seconded by Trustee Sheridan.
2	All in favor?
3	(Chorus of ayes.)
4	CHAIRMAN FORTUNA: I want everybody to
5	have a great Thanksgiving. Please have fun and we
6	will see you in December.
